
Supporting women entrepreneurs remains a top priority. The CGI Women's Loan Program has empowered women-led businesses to grow, innovate, and lead positive change in our community.

Some even donated their earnings to local charities, while others saved up for personal goals—showing not only entrepreneurial spirit but generosity and foresight.

POWER UP NORTH

Building Momentum in the North

Held in October 2024 at Portage College, Power Up North brought together entrepreneurs, professionals, and community leaders from across Northeastern Alberta for two impactful days of learning, networking, and inspiration. With 151 attendees and a lineup of renowned keynote speakers, this year's conference was more than an event—it was a catalyst for rural business growth and community revitalization.

The experience began with a welcome mixer at Fat Unicorn Brewery, where conversations flowed as easily as ideas. The following day was packed with highenergy keynotes from speakers like Diana Noble, Jennifer Barroll, and Brad Kotowich, who shared bold insights on leadership, workforce strategies, and building standout brands. Workshops offered practical takeaways on everything from digital marketing to hiring in rural communities, while the resource tradeshow gave attendees direct access to local business tools and support services.

One of the most powerful moments came during the Wine & Cheese Q&A, where guests engaged in candid, one-on-one dialogue with keynote speakers—s-

parking conversations that carried into future plans and partnerships.

Community Futures Lac La Biche played a central role in organizing and hosting the event, securing sponsors, coordinating logistics, and ensuring that the content addressed the real challenges facing rural entrepreneurs. The initiative aligns with PrairiesCan's priorities by strengthening local economies, enhancing business resiliency, and supporting innovation in rural regions.

Feedback confirmed the event's success: over 88% of attendees rated it as high-quality and informative, while 68% reported gaining new tools to address pressing business challenges—particularly around staffing and growth. Even more importantly, the event left attendees energized and connected, with many already asking when they could return.

Power Up North 2024 wasn't just a conference—it was a spark. And that spark is already igniting new ideas, partnerships, and opportunities across the region.








Loan Portfolio Performance
